- Somali journalist Mohamed Ibrahim Rageh was shot to death on Sunday outside his home in Mogadishu by unknown gunmen, becoming the fourth journalist killed in his country this year, officials said
- He fled Mogadishu in September 2009 after a spate of killings, and was among a few journalists who had returned to continue their careers.

- The internal security minister was yesterday summoned by the parliament for questioning •
- The minister said that the attacks stopped by the government included planned attacks on neighboring countries such as Ethiopia and Kenya.
- The minister, Mr. Abdi Kariin Hussein Guled also said that the government will not entertain illegal road barriers along the roads leading to lower Shabelle region.
- He said that al-Shabaab used the road blocks to generate funds to survive and used government troop's uniforms with the intention of spoiling the dignity of the force and undermining its legitimacy in the eyes of the Somali people

- Djibouti parliamentary Speaker, Idris Arnaud Ali, announced in Wednesday that Djibouti was planning to send additional troops to joint those already in the African Union Mission in Somalia
- The first Djibouti forces were sent to Belet Weyne in Hiiraan region in central Somalia. Al-Shabaab forces were expelled from the town by Ethiopian and Somali government forces in September last year.
- The extra deployment of Djibouti troops is to help prevent any security vacuum as more Ethiopian forces leave

Somali Government Will Not Recognise Jubbaland Conference, Guled says

- The Somali Federal Government will not recognise decisions reached by the ongoing Jubbaland state formation conference in Kismayo, Interior and National Security Minister Abdikarim Hussein Guled said
- "Despite [the fact that] the meeting was organised by Somali citizens, the conference still lacks legitimacy and is against the country's constitution" he said.
- Abdinasir Serar, spokesman for the Ras Kamboni militia said the government must rectify any mistake from the Kismayo conference, but stressed that Jubbaland fits within the constitutional framework of federalism.
