Rebecca Hamilton is the author of *Fighting for Darfur*: *Public Action and the Struggle to Stop Genocide*, a multi-year investigation into the impact of the U.S.-based citizen advocacy movement on Darfur policy. She conducted over 150 interviews with policy-makers and senior representatives within the U.S administration, the UN, the Arab League, and spoke with survivors and perpetrators of the atrocities in Darfur. Currently a journalist at Reuters, she has also worked as Special Correspondent on Sudan for *The Washington Post*, a Pulitzer Center grantee, and a fellow at the New America Foundation and her writing has been published in a range of outlets including *Foreign Affairs, Foreign Policy, The New Republic, Newsweek, The Atlantic, Christian Science Monitor* and *The International Herald Tribune*. A graduate of Harvard with a joint degree from Harvard Law School (Juris Doctor) and Harvard Kennedy School (Master of Public Policy), she has also worked as a lawyer at the International Criminal Court.
