Tribal Insurrection and the para-military Salwa Judum in India

For the past one year, India has witnessed a seething mass revolt by Adivasi (aboriginal) tribal people in a central swathe of the country, comprising of nearly 200 districts. The Government of India has sent in a para-military force of 250,000 soldiers, armed with light to heavy armoury, helicopters, mortars, counter-insurgency trained commandos. New airstrips are being built in the region. In addition, the government has herded the tribals out of over 600 villages and placed them in strategic hamlets. These hamlets are in turn policed by a section of the tribal population, fully armed, known as the Selwa Judum. Who are they? What is behind this major strife? What are the actual conditions on the ground? Why has the Indian government declared such an offensive against its own citizens? What is the impact of such divisions amongst the tribal people?
