• Colonel Fall Sikbwe, the Commander of the Military Operational Zone of the Armed Forces, declared that his soldiers have recaptured areas surrounding Walendu Bindi area from the Popular Front for Justice in Congo ("FPJC"). He stated that his soldiers have been in control of communities in Mukatongazi, Zunguluka, Mabili, Apka, and surrounding areas since June 28 and is now requesting that the residents of these areas return to their homes from the Internally Displaced Person ("IDP") camps.

• Members of the Civil Society of Ituri District are satisfied with the reclaiming of several military positions of the FPJC by the DRCongo Armed Forces. They are now requesting that the families from these locations return to their homes from the IDP camps.

- During the celebration of DRCongo's 50th Independence anniversary many were mourning the death of Muhindo Salvator in Beni territory. Salvator was a human rights activist and a representative for the organization "Bon Samaritain".
- He was shot in the chest in his home on June 30, 2010 after armed men in military uniformed forced their way into his home after threatening to kill Salvator's wife.

 Today the Office of the Military Operational Zone in Bunia town, Ituri District, declared that two traditional chiefs from the Walendu Bindi area were arrested in Songolo for their part in recruiting new militants for the efforts of Colonel Cobra Matata.

- Two customary chiefs of Walendu Bindi area were released by the Ituri District army commander following their arrest on July 1. They were accused of recruiting new militants for the FPJC. He stated that the two were going to provide the identities of those doing the recruiting.
- According to a military source, the Lord's resistance Army ("LRA") and the FARDC
 were fighting in Dikoma and Pesi villages in Ango Territory, from June 25 to 27. The
 FARDC killed six LRA fighters, seized LRA leader Dominic Limacho, and freed
 nine abducted people.
