• The Libyan government said Switzerland « caved in to the Libyan warning » following the handing over of a Swiss national to authorities in Tripoli. The Libyan government had asked the Swiss embassy to let Swiss national Rachid Hamdani go back home and hand over Max Goeldi. A Libyan court acquitted Hamdani of alleged violations of migration laws but Goeldi was senteced to four months in prison. The Swiss embassy was accused of using its building's immunity for « unacceptable purposes ». Libyan relations with Switzerland deteriorated after 188 Libyans were banned, including Al-Qadhafi and his family. Tripoli replied by banning all Europeans living in the Schengen visa zone from entering Libya.
