- President Mahmud Ahmadinezhad has said that it goes without saying that Iran's Islamic Revolution is the history's biggest event after the movement of divine prophets.
- 'We are in the middle of a great event of the contemporary history,' he added.
- 'When we speak about revolution, we do not mean merely political or economic independence, or republicanism and materialistic progress, but the main topic is human being,' he said.
- He noted that the revolution does not only belong to Muslims or followers of divine religions.
 'Revolution goes beyond all this and it belongs to all humanity. Revolution does not know any limit or border,' President Ahmadinezhad further said.

- Iran's minister of intelligence, Heydar Moslehi, has said a large number of individuals who have been in contact with the website of "an espionage fund" have been identified, IRNA reported on 30 January.
- The report maintained: "Moslehi hinted at the activity of the website of the Zionist don Ara [as published] fund which had succeeded by deceit to attract young people to carry out espionage acts, and said a large number of individuals who have been in contact with this website have been identified."
- Further in his remarks, Moslehi said: "All those who cooperated with this website were deceived and they have been identified."
- He then urged young people who "have been influenced by the deceitful inculcations of this website
 to take care not to be cheated."

- Majlis Speaker Ali Larijani cabled a message to parliament speakers as well as heads of international
 organizations to condemn assassination of two Iranian nuclear scientists. In the message, Larijani
 said such terrorist moves once again unveiled the role and interference of the Zionist regime as a
 staunch supporter of state terrorism.
- The message reads: "As you are fully aware, the Iranian nation and government from since early stages of the Islamic Revolution in Iran have faced the severest terrorist acts perpetrated with support of certain foreign states," Larijani said. Over 16,000 innocent civilians from various walks of life have been assassinated, he added. Last year we witnessed three separates assassination attempts on Iranian university professors claiming the lives of two of them, he said.
- "Based on confessions made by one of the culprits named Majid Jamali, he was trained in military camps run by the Zionist regime and received instructions and ds [as published] by Zionist officials.
 This indicates the role of the Zionist regime in such crimes and its pursuance of state terrorism", he underlined.

- She was arrested in March 2010 after referring to Tehran's Evin prison to follow-up on the case of her imprisoned husband, Hojjat (Siavash) Montazeri. She was released on a heavy bail a few weeks later.

- "The important point about this tribunal is its discredit among the world nations, and the people do not believe in such Kangaroo courts," the IRIB director reiterated.
- The distrust came after Hezbollah's Secretary General Seyyed Hasan Nasrallah announced in July that he had been informed by the slain leader's son and successor, Sa'd al-Hariri, that the US-sponsored STL is to accuse some Hezbollah members.

- He pointed to warnings of the Supreme Leader Ali Khamene'i adding: "The Supreme Leader showed the maximum level of insight and today the nation has vigilantly embarked on the right path we have to realize that the seditions of last year against Islamic Iran are continuing."

- Tehran has expressed misgivings over Washington's "interference" in the popular revolution in Tunisia that led to the ouster of President Zine El Abidine Ben Ali.
- Citing remarks by the White House officials and a trip to Tunisia by a top US diplomat, Iranian Foreign Ministry Spokesman Ramin Mehmanparast voiced concern over what he described as Washington's "meddling" in the popular movement in the North African country, according to a statement released by the ministry.
- Mehmanparast urged the Tunisian people to remain vigilant and united, expressing hope that the demands of the Muslim Tunisian nation will be fulfilled with the establishment of a fair and democratic system in the country based on Tunisians' "ideological beliefs and values."

 on two women journalists whose journalist husbands are already in prison," said the Paris-based
 media watchdog.
- The group also recently released its annual press freedom index, in which Iran was ranked 175th out
 of 178 countries.

Speaking at a meeting with local officials and residents of East Azarbayjan Province in Tabriz, a member of the Assembly of Experts and interim Friday imam of Tehran, Ayatollah Seyyed Ahmad Khatami, said "enemies" spread the ideology of pan-Turkism in the region predominantly populated by Azeri speakers, and said that "Israelis are trying to set up cultural, military and other bases in the region".

- In the letter, the president referred to the process of discussion and ratification of the plan, and expressed regret about activities of the Majlis' presidium that "contradicted the guidelines of the Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamene'i which, in some cases, "even ignored the Majlis' regulations".

- Two members of the Monafeqin grouplet [Hypocrites; reference to Mojahedin-e Khalq Organization] named as Ja'far Kazemi the son of Sadeq and Mohammad Ali Haj-Aqa'i, the son of Rajab Ali were hanged this morning (Monday).
- According to ILNA, the two Monafeq [hypocrites] were members of an active network of the said grouplet who were involved in the riots [post-election unrest] under the guidance of their main contact in England.
- The trial session for examining the charges of the convicts had been held in the presence of a representative from the prosecutor's office as well as the convicts' lawyers at various benches of the Islamic Revolution courts of Tehran. The sentences were also upheld by the court of appeal.

- Iranian reporter and blogger Siamak Ghaderi has been sentenced to four years in prison as well as a cash fine.
- The former reporter for the official Islamic Republic News Agency (IRNA) has received a four-year jail term for "propaganda against the regime", "disturbing public opinion" and "spreading lies."
- The blogger was jailed in early August [2010] after security forces raided his home.
- Security agents had previously promised to release Ghaderi on the condition that he would agree to
 write articles in support of the Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamene'i and the establishment on
 his personal blog "Our IRNA" which regularly features pro-Green Movement content [sentence as
 published].
