NOVEMBER 7, 2010

- For acting "against security and national unity", Ayandeh website has been referred to two supervisory bodies for "further action".
- Due to "activities contrary to the public interests and for publishing false news", Ayandeh website
 was blocked several times by supervising officials. The ban was removed after mediation of some
 people.
- "However, despite new promises to respect the national interests and unity by its administrators, the website once again breached these promises."
- "Numerous examples of convergence of its activities with the policies of the websites and the opposition and the media that are hostile to the system and based outside the country can be observed."
- In the review report of the supervisory officials about Ayandeh's operations, it is mentioned that insulting and degrading the president of the republic and government, creating division between people and the principle-ist current, sanctifying the sedition, publishing false reports contrary to national interests and security, creating hindrances and putting false reports, especially about the targeted subsidies plan, sowing doubts among people and... [ellipses as published] are some of the wrong deeds of this news website

NOVEMBER 6, 2010

- Health Minister Marziyeh Vahid-Dastjerdi commented on the dissolution of the Iran Medical Sciences University, stressing that "the professors are not unhappy about the dissolution".
- When asked on what basis the decision had been taken, she said "The Development Department and the Human Resource Management of the President's Office issued a statement regarding this and we examined it, realizing it is a good plan we ratified it at the Development Council of the Health Ministry".
- According to the report, currently a committee consisting of representatives from three commissions of Education, Health and Article 90 Committee of the Majlis is pursuing the matter.

NOVEMBER 5, 2010

- The Iranian news agency Mehr published a report on 5 November 2010 that Iran will filter the websites which it considers as "immoral and obscene".
- The report says the head of Special Court for Internet and Cyber Crimes emphasized: "The court's
 anti-cyber crimes cell makes maximum possible effort to prevent obscene and immoral sites from
 operating freely in the country. It continuously monitors all websites with advanced software."
- While talking to journalists about filtering of websites Reza Ja'fari to Mehr said: "It is within the
 court's purview to filter websites to prevent the occurrence of crimes in the virtual space or
 cyberspace. But it cannot filter all the websites because monitoring all the sites is very difficult."
- The head of Special Court for Internet and Cyber Crimes with reference to the "cybercrimes" during the unrest that followed the disputed presidential elections in 2009 said: "Lack of necessary equipment and advanced software were the factors because of which we could not act

appropriately during last year's sedition movement. Meanwhile, many sites took advantage of this and published false news."

- MI6 chief stressed that intelligence and espionage activities could well hinder Iran from pursuing its
 nuclear program. He said that diplomacy in itself was not sufficient to stop Iran's nuclear
 programme, saying that intelligence and espionage activities should go on in regards to Iran's
 nuclear plans. The protesting students chanted slogans against the US and the UK and voiced their
 protest to the remarks of the MI6 chief.

- The Iranian security authorities arrested four people, saying that they were paid by a UK-based individual to carry out assassinations in Iran.
- The Iranian Intelligence Ministry said that the arrest took place in Marivan in western Iran. The authorities seized a number of arms and documents proving their affiliation with a terrorist group that is led by Jalil Fattahi, who lives in Britain.
- The ministry added that the [four] confessed to carrying out five assassinations over the past two years and that they were paid to carry out these terrorist attacks.

- Islamic Republic of Iran Foreign Ministry's Human [Rights] Watch Centre issued a report on human rights abuse in US here Wednesday [4 November] on verge of publication of and survey on annual US Human Rights Report at UN Geneva Headquarters.
- It is stressed in the report that the United States has also still not joined the most important convention related to the economic, social and cultural rights that is among the most important human right documents. The Children's Rights Committee of the United Nations, too, has announced that the United States has been one of the greatest producers and distributors of the world child pornography products, while America is now one of the only two countries in the world that has still not joined the International Children's Rights Convention.

- The website of former Iranian President Mohammad Khatami has been blocked, a message on Khatami's website (Khatami.ir) announced on 3 November.
- The website said that the decision was made by a government committee, headed by the state prosecutor-general, and instructed to the website based on clause 23 of the country's internet crime law. It added: "Based on the official order of the committee, all services by internet providers to the site were to be blocked from Wednesday 3 November."
- The website added: "No announcements, verbal or written, had previously been made to the organizers of the site indicating that a crime had been committed and no explanations were given for the decision."
