1. Libyan T.V., Tripoli in Arabic 11:25 GMT, March 24, 2011

Al-Jamahiriyah T.V. said that the funeral of the "Martyrs" was to take place in Tripoli that afternoon. The "Savage barbaric crusader aggressor" (coalition air strikes) targeted women, children and elderly people.

A Koranic verse was read. After the verse the text read;

"Masses of the Libyan Muslim people are gathering today Thursday [24 March] straight after the afternoon prayer in the martyrs' cemetery on Al-Shatt road in the brave city of Tripoli for funeral prayers for the souls of the pious martyrs who fell victim to the savage, barbaric crusader aggression which targeted women, children and elderly people in our safe cities and villages.

"May God have mercy on our martyrs and accept them, may God be praised, among the good."

2. Libyan T.V. Tripoli in Arabic 10:46 GMT. March 24, 2011

Military sources stated that civilian and military sites in Tajura district in Tripoli were now being subjected to bombing by colonialist crusaders.

3. Libyan T.V. at 08:37 GMT March 24, 2011

Libyan Al-Jamahiriyah TV said in a regular news broadcast that "civilian and military" targets in three areas of the country had been bombed by the coalition forces.

The report showed footage of people injured in the hospital and some body bags that appear to be corpses.

"Civilian and Military sites in Tripoli have been subjected to bombing for the colonialist crusader aggressor for a second time after dawn today Thursday (24 March)" stated military sources.

Civilian and military sites in Tajurah district of Tripoli have been bombed the night before, the presenter said. The town of Sabha had also been bombed earlier in the morning and that Al-Jufrah sha'biya both located in central Libya.

The report then cut to the inside of a hospital: Medics tending to wounded men on trolley beds, no serious injuries were shown. This followed by a shot from what appears to be a hospital mortuary filled with body bags.

4. Libyan T.V. March 23, 2011

Military sources said that civilian and military instillations in Al-Jufrah in Southern Libya have been subjected to air strikes by the colonialist and Crusader aggressors.

5. Libyan T.V. March 23, 2011 1907 GMT

"Military source: A few moments ago, the Tajurah area in Tripoli was the subject of an imperialist, Crusader raid against some civilian and military targets," Libyan TV reported in an "urgent" screen caption

7. Libyan T.V. March 23, 2011 15:57 GMT

"Crowds of citizens - men, women, young people and children - now continue to pour into Bab al-Aziziyah [Mu'ammar al-Qadhafi's compound] in Tripoli to join the masses that have been sitting in there for days,"

Screen Split One side, captioned in Arabic and English "Bab al-Aziziyah - Now", and showed crowds of people waving Al-Qadhafi photos and green flags. The other, captioned "Studio - Live", showed a presenter and a shaykh discussing the nature of the "crusader" aggression.
