"Military source: The armed forces urge armed groups that had decided to handover their weapons in Al-Zintan sha'biyah, that the headquarters of the martyr "Abd-el-Salam Sahban" brigade and the headquarters of the popular social command in Kaklah sha'biyah are the two locations for handing over weapons. Libyan PM scathing about Contact Group, says Al-Qadhafi "grieving" for son

At a press conference in Tripoli at 1047 gmt on 7 May, the Libyan secretary of the General People's Committee (Prime Ministry), Baghdadi al-Mahmudi alleged that NATO had used uranium in its bombs, which, he said, had so far killed "thousands of civilians".

The Libyan prime minister said that Libya was "not in need of aid. Libya has one authority, one nation, one land, one homeland".

On the topic of Amnesty International's statement that "war crimes" had taken place in Misratah, Al-Mahmudi said: "Has Amnesty International visited Misratah to see this or did it get its information from the media? There are facts on the ground, and no-one can hide a crime. Any inspector can look into the facts. If there are signs of a crime this will be seen, and if there is, then we will look for a perpetrator. We shouldn't prejudge."
