Session 1: The Sudanese Diaspora in Canada: Possibilities for Reconciliation and Development

In its inaugural session at Concordia University, UofMosaic will explore the role that the diasporas from North and South Sudan can play in encouraging rapprochement between the two states. The recent tension between Sudan and South Sudan over post---secession borders, particularly in regions rich in natural resources, is a matter of urgent concern both for Africa and for the wider international community.
