Finally, let me mention these inaccurate branches and other practices which greatly deprive children of the benefits of breastfeeding.

The themes that will be developed during this colloquium will deal with the analysis of the situation of infant feeding and nutrition in Rwanda, the advantages of breast milk considered at medical, epidemiological and economic levels, the impact of breast milk on other programmes and finally policies and actions to be taken.

SPEAKER: Anastase NZABILINDA:

On his part, the UNICEF representative, Mr. Thomas FRANKLEY, stressed that breast milk was a miracle product capable of nourishing and immunising all infants of the world.

SPEAKER: Thomas FRANKLEY, UNICEF Representative:

Breast milk is a miracle product capable of nourishing and immunising all infants of the world. It can be made available anywhere, it does not require preservation nor does it present delivery problems. Besides, it helps mothers plan their families while reducing risks of cancer.

But due to a systematic (sic) by producers of artificial milk, many men and women believe that powdered milk is better and more nutritious than breast milk. This belief persists despite the indisputable scientific evidence that breast milk is infinitely superior to anything produced by even the most advanced of technologies.

In Rwanda, I visited a large hospital which kept feeding bottles in the room used for oral rehydration. On another occasion, I was informed that a nutrition programme could no longer be continued because there was no more powdered milk.
